Gleaning means picking up the bits of corn left behind by the reapers. God had kindly made a law to make sure there was free food for the most needy.


Look at Ruth chapter 2

Boaz knew how kind Ruth had been to Naomi, so he provided food, water and protection for Ruth. He even told his men to drop some extra grain for Ruth to collect. Ruth was surprised at his kindness, as she was only a poor foreigner.

4. By the end of the day Ruth had collected *only a handful of grain / a lot of grain*


