The Samarean. 7) What was the Sews opinion of Samareans.
8) What did he have that the others did not have? (v33)
9) He helped the poor victim. Could he have done any more for the man?
10) Was it the sort of help the man needed?
11) Did it cost him anything?

1) The traveller: Life is a journey. Who does the traveller in the parable represent?
What have we been attacked by?
How does Romans 5 v 10 describe people before conversion?
2) The religious people, including the Lawyer who asked the question:
What was their big problem?
What does this parable show them about their supposed 'goodness'?
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Do you think of yourself as 'good'? Beware! The Bible says we ar all sinners. Our 'goodness' is not acceptable to God. So He sent Someone else who was perfect to rescue us.
3) The Samaritan: Who does this man represent in the
journey of our life?
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Have you ever come to Jesus to be put right? Thank Him if you have!

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
