Tax collectors were usually corrupt and greedy ('extortioners'). 3) The Pharisee compared himself with the worst people he could think of. Why did he do this?	
4) How is this tax collector different to the Pharisee?	
5) Was he interested in what other people were like?	
Now read verse 14 again. 'Justified' = put right with God. 'Exalted' = up. 'Abased' = brought down.	= lifted
6) Which of the two men's prayers was heard?	•••••

A matter of the heart	
Jesus was teaching that when we pray He is interested in our heart $m{\Psi}$, not our position in life. Take a look at the Pharisee's prayer in v 11-12.	
Who is his prayer all about?	10 mm
Does he actually ask for anything? He was full of in his heart.	
Now check out the tax collector's prayer in verse 13. How many words did he use?	
What did he think of himself?	
What did he think of God?

Who are you most like? When you pray, do you tell God how good YOU are, or all about what YOU have done?
