
MOUNT ZION BAPTIST CHURCH **SUNDAY SCHOOL BULLETIN NO 19**

This week we reach the end of the journey for the Israelites. They had walked around the wilderness for 40 years, learning that God's way is best. All the older generation had died, except Caleb and Joshua. Read Deuteronomy 34 v 9.





Look at Joshua 4 v 9,19-24. 7) What did Joshua set up to help them remember this miracle? (v 20)

The Israelites were home! Although they faced many battles ahead (which we will learn about another time), they trusted that God would help them.

Our life is like a journey too. We live in this world only for a time. At the end of our journey eternity awaits each one of us.

8) What 'home' do Christians look forward to?

As they face difficulties in this life, they can trust that one day they will be at peace, living with the God they love and serve here for ever and ever. Can you say that? Have you trusted in Jesus to take you to Heaven?

What is Heaven like?

By comparing the wilderness journey with life in Canaan, we can learn how wonderful Heaven is to a Christian after the struggles in life on earth.



- 1) A permanent home. What had the Israelites been living in all through their journey? What a relief to be able to settle down!
- **2 Corinthians 5 v 1** compares our body on earth to a tent. One day it will be taken down for the last time. Death for a Christian is like

crossing a river and arriving safely in the promised land of Heaven for ever.

2) Fruit to eat. What had the Israelites been eating all through their journey? Now they were in a land where fruit and other food grew easily. When Christians reach Heaven, they will enjoy the wonderful pleasure of being spiritually fruitful no more sin!



3) Their own land. The Israelites had been 'foreigners' for many, many years. Now they had a place of their own to live. Heaven is a home for those for whom Jesus has died. Read John 14 v 1-2. What has Jesus prepared for His people?




We all have many blessings from God every day. Think of some things you could say Thank You to God for. Write one thing in each stone, and then say Thank You! The first one is done for you.

Read Joshua 3 v 1-4, 14-17

After 40 years in the desert, all the older Israelites had died - all except Joshua and Caleb, two faithful men. Even Moses had died. God said that Joshua was the new leader.

The people came at last very near the Promised Land which was to be their new home. In front of them was the River Jordan, overflowing its banks. There was no way across. God told Joshua that He would stop the river flowing as soon as the feet of the priests touched the water.

The people trusted God. The priests carried the special Ark from the tabernacle down to the river. As they put their feet into the Jordan, the water stopped flowing! God stopped it! Everyone could cross safely to their new home.

People who trust in Jesus will be taken safely to their new home at the end of their life. They will go to Heaven to live with God.
