The next three parables are about 'lost' things. When Jesus repeats something, it means it is very important. We should listen up and see what it means for us even today.




The Lost Sheep

Read Luke 15 v 1-7.
1) What sort of people were wanting to listen to Jesus? (v 1)
2) Do you think the religious leaders approved of Jesus talking to this sort of people? (v 2)
3) How many sheep does the shepherd in the parable have? (v 4)
4) How many get lost?
6) How much does the shepherd care about each individual sheep? (v 5)
7) What does the shepherd do when he has brought it safely back?
Jesus compares this joy and rejoicing with what happens in Heaven when one person who knows they are a sinner and is truly sorry (repents) comes to Jesus for forgiveness.

Read Luke 15 v 1-7

Jesus told another parable. A shepherd had 100 sheep. One night he noticed one was missing. He left the other 99 sheep safely in their fold and went to search for the lost sheep.

The shepherd looked everywhere until he found it. Then he brought it back home on his shoulders. He was very happy and told all his friends and neighbours about it.

Jesus is like a Shepherd. He cares very much for His people, like a shepherd cares for his sheep. Jesus gives them all they need. He comforts them, and protects them.

We are all like that lost sheep. We need Jesus to rescue us from our sin. He died on the cross to rescue lost people like you and me. We need to say sorry to Jesus for our sins and ask Him to rescue us. Will you do that?
