	The Lord provided water for the 2 million people and animals. This was a miracle!		
	After resting at an oasis the people moved on. Look at Exodus 16.		
	4) What were the people complaining to Moses about in v 3?		
	5) Do you think this was a right reaction? Should they have trusted in God to provide for them?		
	6) What was God's kind answer to the problem of food? (v 4, 14-15) 7) What did they call it, and what was it like? (v 31) God also sent many quails, a small bird, for them to eat at that time. The Lord gave Moses special instructions for the people on how to collect the Manna. All they had to do was to obey. Read verses 16-30. 8) Did everyone obey? (v 20, 27)		
	9) Does everyone obey God's command to trust in Him?		
	In spite of their complaints and disobedience, the Lord was very kind to the people. He gave them all they needed for the rest of their long journey.		
God's wonderful provision			
	The Christian life is like a journey through the desert of this world. There is nothing in this world which satisfies a believer's heart longings, or gives true meaning and purpose to life. Only God can provide living water and the bread of life for those who ask for it. Do you remember Who is the Living Water and the Bread of Life?		

This means that God will give everlasting life to every one who truly comes to Jesus, trusting in Him and asking for their sins to be forgiven. If you don't come to Him, you will not be saved! Why wait any longer?
